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### STUDENT BODY

The total student population for the 2021-22 school year is 389 students. There are 156 students enrolled in the Upper School (7-12) and 18 graduating in the Class of 2022. The school is diverse in both academic and socio-economic backgrounds with 39% of our population self reporting ethnic diversity and 60% receiving Financial aid. International Students represent 2.5% of grades 7-12. Students represent 45 communities in Eastern Massachusetts. The school emphasizes small classes (15 average) which fosters close student-faculty relations and a commitment to help students develop their academic skills and personal talents in a supportive, Christian environment.

### HISTORY & STRUCTURE

Founded in 1991 as a Grammar School, our first graduating class of seniors matriculated in 2010. Covenant is a classical school in terms of both pedagogy and curricula. The administration includes a Head of School, Grammar School Principal, Dean of Academics, Dean of Students, Chief Financial Officer, Director of Institutional Advancement, Director of Admissions, Director of Fine Arts, and Athletic Director.

*Covenant Christian Academy is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) and is a member of the Association of Classical Christian Schools (ACCS), the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI), National Honor Society (NHS), and New England Preparatory School Athletic Council (NEPSAC).*

## FACULTY AND STAFF

Covenant Christian Academy's faculty, (Early Childhood through Upper School), is comprised of 39 teachers and 6 classroom assistants. All of our teachers, Kindergarten through grade 12, have undergraduate degrees and 65% hold an advanced degree. Our student teacher ratio is 8:1. Our faculty and staff have been recognized with achievements such as teaching excellence awards, and have had articles and poems published nationally. Many Upper School faculty also teach at the collegiate level.

## ACADEMIC SCHEDULE

The academic year consists of two 17-week semesters. Students have seven periods a day, and a full credit course meets four times a week for 50 minutes each.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A total of 25 credits, including the completion and defense of a Senior Thesis Project, are required for graduation:

- Bible - 3 Credits
- English - 4 Credits
- History - 4 Credits
- Mathematics - 4 Credits
- Science - 3 Credits
- Latin - 3 Credits
- Rhetoric - 1.5 Credit (Senior Thesis Project)
- Fine Arts - 1.5 Credits
- Physical Education - 1.0 Credits

## GPA AND CLASS RANK

A **cumulative GPA** is calculated each semester from the start of 9th grade for all courses taken at CCA. **All of our core courses are taught at the honors level** and are designated as such on the transcript. Honors courses are not weighted. AP courses are given a .7 point weighting. Class Rank is determined by the GPA, however, CCA is a limited-ranking school, only reporting class rank for Valedictorian or Salutatorian, due to the small class size.

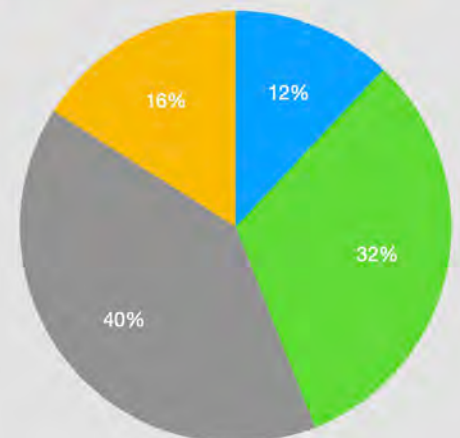

### SENIOR THESIS

#### THE CAPSTONE OF A COVENANT EDUCATION

The Senior Thesis Project at Covenant Christian Academy is the culmination of our students' Classical Education. After writing a fifteen page research essay on a topic of their choosing, each student must defend his or her argument in front of the Upper School (Gr. 7-12), along with a panel of faculty members and outside experts. The Thesis Project demands the scholarly depth, expert rhetoric, and personal confidence that are essential to our students' success in collegiate studies and professional life.

### ACADEMIC TRAVEL WEEK

The classroom is a wonderful place to learn, but the opportunity to venture out of the predictable space where routines have been established can energize learning in special ways. Academic Travel Week gives students an opportunity to "take their learning on the road" and have direct, hands-on experiences.

### ATHLETICS

The Athletic Program at Covenant Christian Academy is designed to provide student athletes the opportunity to enjoy interscholastic competition for three seasons during the school year. We currently offer three seasons of sports with 18 competitive teams at the middle and high school levels. 85% of Upper School Students are active in Athletic offerings.

### FINE ARTS

The CCA Fine Arts department offers a full slate of opportunities for students to participate in private instrumental lessons, instrumental ensembles, chorale ensembles, theater productions, and visual arts experiences. 75% of Upper School Students are active in the Fine Arts offerings.

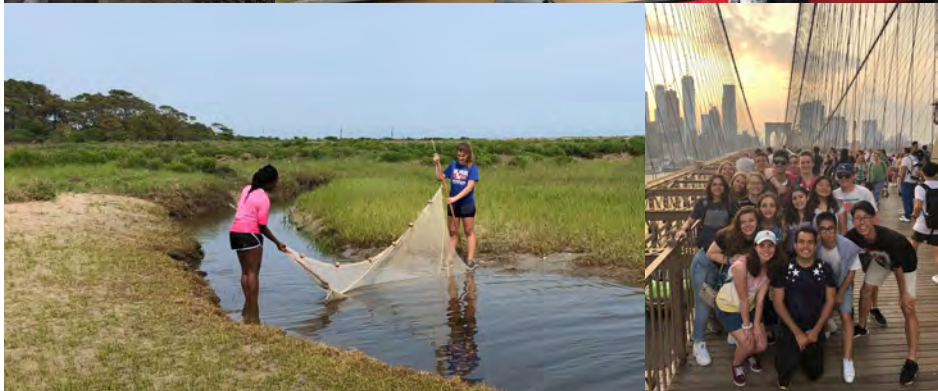

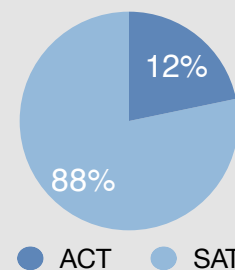

### SPRING 2020

In the early spring of 2020, the Governor of Massachusetts, Charlie Baker, mandated that all schools (public and private) close to in-person teaching for two weeks. The reality, as we know now, was that school would be closed for the remainder of the 2019-2020 academic year.

Administrators at Covenant began planning in earnest for a potential school closure in January of 2020 as the virus was just reaching our shores. As a result, when the closure mandate came through on Friday, March 13th, Covenant was ready to transition to a full and robust remote learning solution called "Covenant@Home". CCA Faculty and Administrators took one professional day to finalize plans and logistics, and then rolled out the Remote Learning Program on Tuesday, March 17th for all students, Pre-k through Grade 12.

For students in the Rhetoric School (Gr. 9-12) Covenant@Home included both synchronous and asynchronous learning time each week. The schedule was modified from a normal in school schedule, but students were still able to complete the required curriculum in each grade. This achievement allowed us to issue letter grades with confidence for all students in all academic courses. AP Students completed their coursework and successfully took all AP exams. Seniors were able to deliver and defend their Senior Thesis live, albeit remotely, through Zoom Conferencing.

Despite the obvious interruptions that the COVID-19 pandemic presented to everyday life, we are pleased that the academic work of students at Covenant Christian Academy continued in a real and meaningful way.
