### OUR MISSION

Covenant Christian Academy (CCA) offers a Christian and Classical education that builds our students' academic, spiritual and social foundations for lives of leadership and service in today's global community. A Covenant education prepares students to excel in collegiate studies and intellectual pursuits, nurtures Christian faith and character, and fosters individual gifts and abilities.

### OUR SCHOOL

Founded in 1991, Covenant Christian Academy is a Christian and Classical, college preparatory, non-denominational day school serving students in preschool through grade 12.

### STUDENT BODY

The total student population for the 2025-26 school year is 433 students. There are 176 students enrolled in the Upper School (7-12) with 24 graduating in the Class of 2026. The school is diverse in both academic and socio-economic backgrounds with 36% of our population self reporting ethnic diversity and 32% receiving Financial Aid. Students represent 57 communities in Eastern Massachusetts, Southern New Hampshire, and China. The school emphasizes small classes (15 average) which fosters close student-faculty relations and a commitment to help students develop their academic skills and personal talents in a supportive, Christian environment.

### HISTORY & STRUCTURE

Founded in 1991 as a Grammar School, our first graduating class of seniors matriculated in 2010. Covenant is a classical school in terms of both pedagogy and curricula. The administration includes a Head of School, Grammar School Principal, Upper School Principal, Dean of Academics, Chief Finance and Operating Officer, Chief Advancement Officer, Director of Marketing & Communications, Director of Admissions, USLR Director of Academic Support, Director of Fine Arts, Director of Security, and Athletic Director.

### FACULTY AND STAFF

CCA's faculty, (Early Childhood through Upper School), is comprised of 46 teachers and 12 classroom assistants. All of our teachers, Kindergarten through grade 12, have undergraduate degrees and 50% hold an advanced degree. Our student teacher ratio is 9:1. Our faculty and staff have been recognized with achievements such as teaching excellence awards, and have had articles, books, and poems published nationally. Many Upper School faculty also teach at the collegiate level.

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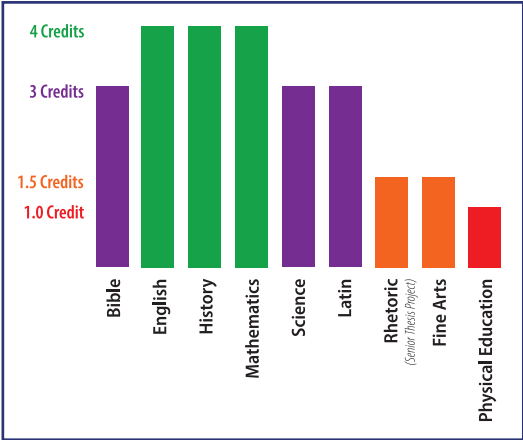
# ACADEMIC SCHEDULE

The academic year consists of two 17-week semesters. Students have seven periods a day, and a full credit course meets four times a week for 45 minutes each. Lab sciences meet five periods per week.

# GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A total of 25 credits, including the completion and defense of a Senior Thesis Project, are required for graduation.

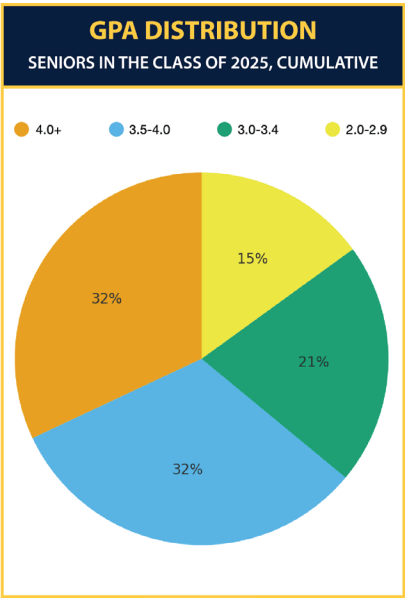

# GPA AND CLASS RANK

A cumulative GPA is calculated each semester from the start of 9th grade for all courses taken at CCA. All of our core courses are taught at the honors level and are designated as such on the transcript. Honors courses are not weighted. AP courses are given a .7 point weighting. Class Rank is determined by the GPA, however, CCA is a limited-ranking school, only reporting class rank for Valedictorian or Salutatorian, due to the small class size.

## SPECIAL CURRICULUM FEATURES

### SENIOR THESIS

#### THE CAPSTONE OF A COVENANT EDUCATION

The Senior Thesis Project at Covenant Christian Academy is the culmination of our students' Classical Education. After writing a fifteen page research essay on a topic of their choosing, each student must defend his or her argument in front of the Upper School (Gr. 7-12), along with a panel of faculty members and outside experts. The Thesis Project demands the scholarly depth, expert rhetoric, and personal confidence that are essential to our students' success in collegiate studies and professional life.

### PREFECTS

The Prefect Program — a lead-by-example model — allows seniors to lead the school in key areas of Student Life. Each Prefect is paired with a staff mentor and Prefects lead a council of students to lead initiatives, organize events, and contribute to a flourishing school environment. The Prefect Program is committed to helping students grow in understanding of the Gospel and servant-leadership, experience community through building relationships, and serve others faithfully. ### CLASSICAL ROOTS



Covenant Christian Academy's Classical Roots Program is a regenerative agricultural program committed to propagating truth, beauty, and goodness through organic gardening, curriculum integration, and community service. The Classical Roots Program aims to create beautiful and fruitful garden spaces on CCA's campus that will welcome wildlife, extend our classrooms into the outdoors, heal our local biome, and foster rich conversations about the stewardship of creation.

### BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

Beyond the Classroom experiences give students the opportunity to venture out of the classroom where routines have been established. These experiences provide our students opportunities to immerse themselves in different cultures and activities, to experience beauty through creation and through the arts, and to strengthen relationships within the CCA community.

Past day trip experiences have included Gordon College's La Vida Adventure Park, the North Shore Music Theatre, and the Crane Estate. Overnight trips have included Gettysburg, PA, NYC, NY, Washington, DC, Acadia National Park, ME, the Adirondack Mountains, Cape Cod, MA, Quebec City, Canada, and Orvieto, Italy.

A small group of juniors and seniors have the opportunity to travel to Italy for an experience grounded in our Christian and classical identity. Students are chosen through an application process for a program called *In Situ Orvieto*, which means "in place." The program was developed to support slow, deliberate, and contextualized experiences in some of Italy's most amazing locations. The remaining juniors and seniors experience *In Situ Boston* travel days the same week.

### ATHLETICS



The Athletic Program at Covenant Christian Academy is designed to provide student athletes the opportunity to enjoy interscholastic competition for three seasons during the school year. We currently offer three seasons of sports with 18 competitive teams at the middle and high school levels. 85% of Upper School Students are active in Athletic offerings.
